

**Borough of Norwood**

**Ordinance No. 15:15**

**An Ordinance Amending Chapter 42 of the Code of  
the Borough of Norwood to Mandate Direct Deposit  
for Borough Employees**

**WHEREAS**, P.L. 2013, c. 28 (N.J.S.A. 52:14-15f), authorizes local governments to mandate direct deposit of compensation for certain government employees effective after July 1, 2014, and permits governing bodies to grant exemptions on the terms and conditions that they deem necessary; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this ordinance is to authorize this direct deposit in the Borough of Norwood in accordance with the applicable statute.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1: A new Section 42-13 of Chapter 42 of the Code of the Borough of Norwood is added to state the following:

§42-13. Direct Deposit of Employee Compensation

- A. All full time employees and elected public officials who receive compensation from the Borough of Norwood are mandated to have direct deposit of their net pay in a banking institution specified as of January 1, 2016 in accordance with Chapter 28, P.L. 2013, as codified under N.J.S.A. 52:14-15f (b) and (c).
- B. Seasonal and temporary employees who are employed by the Borough of Norwood are exempt from the direct deposit mandate.
- C. Municipal employees may request, in writing, an exemption from the direct deposit mandate to the Borough of Norwood Administrator. Such requests will be presented to the Mayor and Council within fourteen days. The Mayor and Council may grant such an exemption by resolution and only for good cause.

Section 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of any inconsistencies.

Section 3: The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, the remaining parts of this ordinance will remain in full force and effect.


Section 4: This ordinance will take effect upon final approval and publication, according to law.


