

**Borough of Norwood
Ordinance No. 16:17**

**An Ordinance Amending Chapter 222 the Code
of the Borough of Norwood Regulating Vehicles
and Traffic to Regulate Parking in the Borough's
Parking Lots.**

WHEREAS, the purpose of this ordinance is to better regulate traffic in the best interests of the citizens and motorists in the Borough of Norwood by limiting parking in certain spaces in the Borough's parking lots.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Norwood as follows:

Section 1: A new Section 222-10.3 is added to the Code of the Borough of Norwood ("Code"), as follows:

§222-10.3 Parking Restricted in Borough Parking Lots.

No person may park a vehicle in violation of the restrictions applicable to the parking spaces designated in the locations described in Schedule XXI (§222-53) attached to and made a part of this chapter.

Section 2: A new Section 222-53 is added to the Code as follows:

§222-53. Schedule XXI. Parking Restricted in Borough Parking Lots.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10.3, no persons may park a vehicle in violation of the following limitations:

Location of Lot	Side	Limitation
Tri Plex Building 453 Broadway	West	Police personnel or those conducting business with the police department only
Tri Plex Building 453 Broadway	North	DPW personnel only

Section 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of any inconsistencies.

Section 4: The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part or parts of this ordinance is or are declared to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, then the remaining parts of this ordinance will remain in full force and effect.


Section 5: This ordinance will take effect upon final approval and publication according to law.


