



## The Northern Valley Greenway

The Northern Valley Greenway (NVG) is an inter-municipal project to convert 7.5 miles of unused rail line in Northeastern Bergen County to a long, multi-use recreational greenway. It aims to create a safe, off-road, recreational environment for pedestrians, runners and bikers along with attractive seating and possible amenities like dog parks, exercise stations, and sculpture displays. The path will start in Tenafly, NJ and connect to the Joseph B. Clarke Trail in Tappan, NY, which will hook up with the bicycle path on the new Mario M. Cuomo (Tappan Zee) Bridge.

Last year the six towns along the rail (Closter, Cresskill, Demarest, Northvale, Norwood and Tenafly) passed coordinated resolutions in support of the project and formed an inter-municipal committee to develop a plan. Nearby towns like Alpine, Rockleigh, Old Tappan, Harrington Park and Bergenfield have also passed similar supporting resolutions.
